Like and Would Like: Listen and repeat.

Question ?	Positive +	Negative -
Do you like to play soccer?	Yes, I always like to play soccer.	No, I don't like to play soccer.
Does he like to exercise?	Yes, he likes to exercise every day.	No, he doesn't like to exercise.
Would you like to practice now?	Yes, I' d like to practice.	No, I wouldn't like to practice.
Would she like to walk tomorrow?	Yes, she' d like to walk.	No, she wouldn't like to walk.



Quotation marks “ ” and commas ,

Quotation marks show the words someone said. Commas go between the words **said** or **asked** and the quotation marks.

Jesus said, “Every person who believes in me will be saved.”

God said, “I have heard your prayers.”

Jesus asked, “Who do you say I am?”

Peter said, “You are the Christ, the son of the living God.”

Peter Preaches to Cornelius [Acts 10:1-48](#)



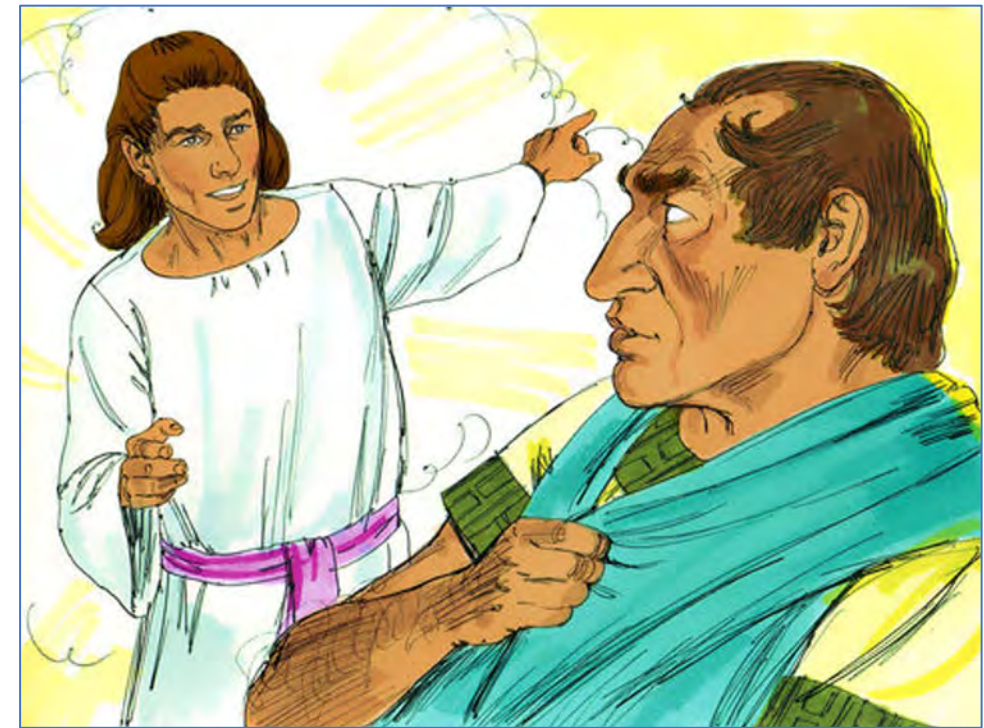
There was a man named Cornelius. He was not a Jew. He was a good man and worshiped the true God. He prayed to God and did good things for other people.



One day, Cornelius had a vision.
An angel from God came to him.

The angel said, "God has heard your prayers. God knows about your faith and the good things you do. Now send some men to Joppa to find Peter and bring him to you."

Cornelius obeyed the angel.





The next day at noon, Peter was praying. He had a vision, too. It was a strange vision. He did not know what it meant.

Peter saw a big cloth sheet coming down from the sky. The sheet had all kinds of animals, snakes, and birds on it.





A voice said, "Get up, Peter. Kill them and eat them."

But Peter said, "No. I do not eat things which are unclean."

The voice said, "It is all right. God has made all these things clean." This happened three times. Then Peter could not see the sheet any more.





Peter was thinking about the vision. Then the men from Cornelius came to his house.

The Holy Spirit said to Peter, "Go with them. Do not ask any questions because I have sent them to you."

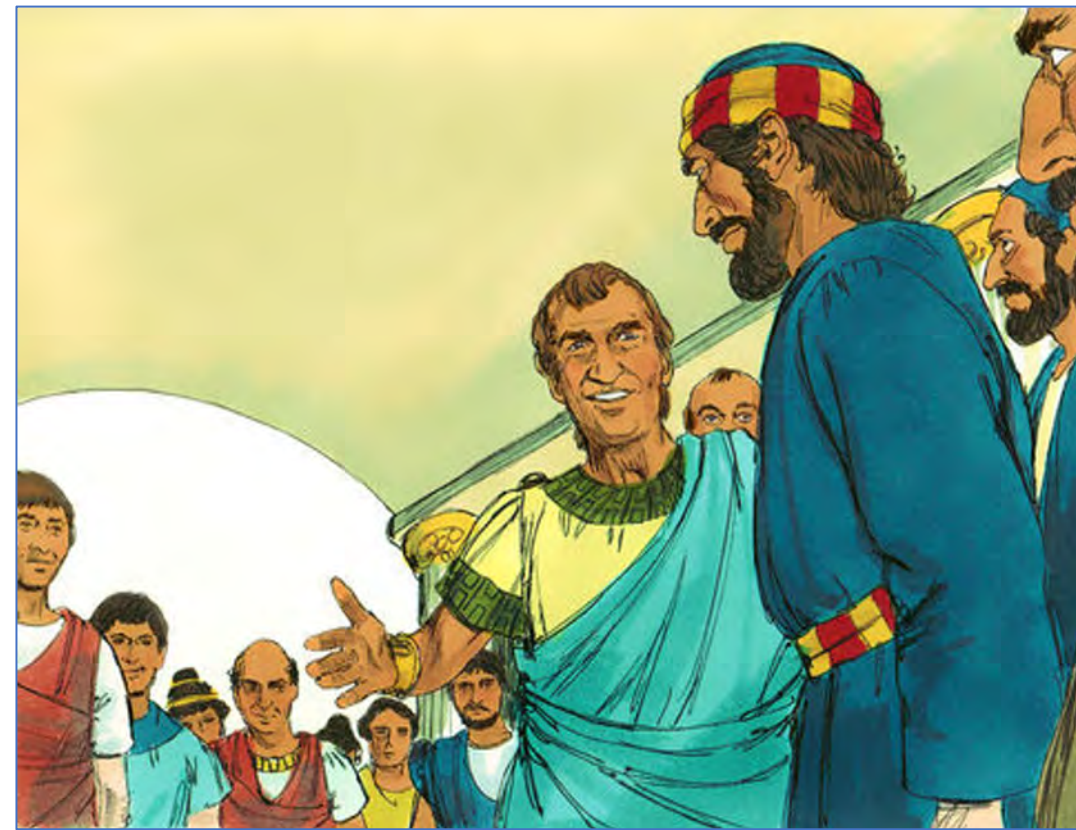
It was against Jewish law to visit non-Jewish people. The Jews thought those people were unclean. But God showed Peter that he should not call anyone unclean.





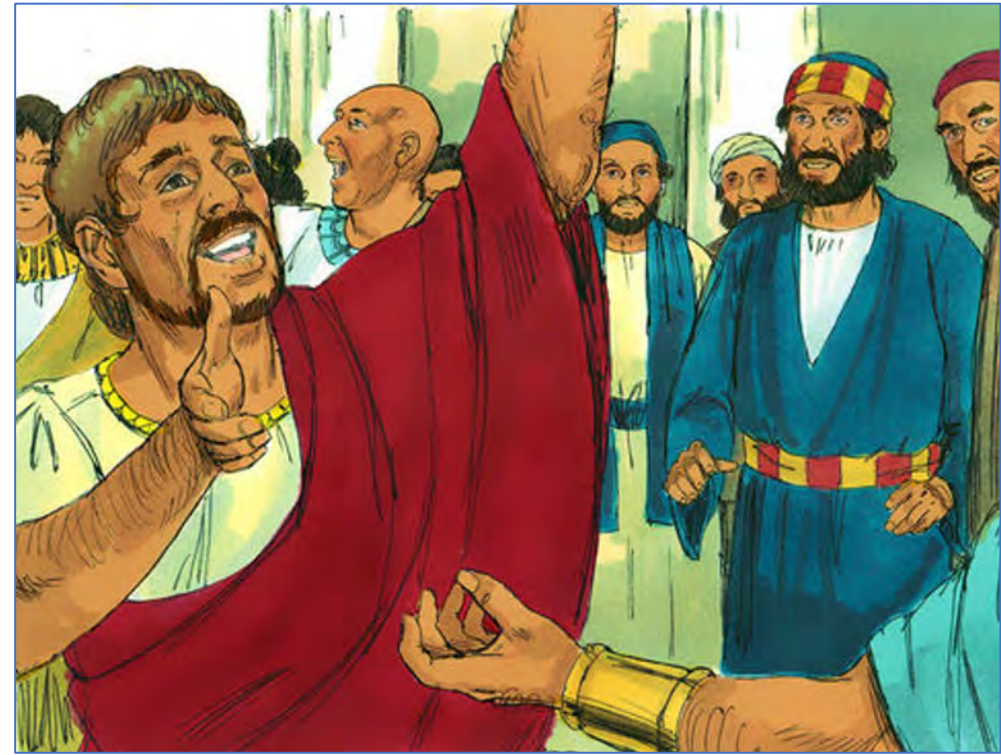
The next day, Peter went with the men to Cornelius' house. Peter said, "I had a strange vision. Now I know what the vision means.

All people are the same in God's eyes. It is not important what country they are from. It is not important what tribe they are from. Jesus came to earth and died for all people. Every person who believes in Jesus will be saved. God will forgive their sins."





The Holy Spirit came upon the people as Peter was preaching. Peter saw this. He said, "These foreign people received the Holy Spirit just as we Jews did." So Peter told them to be baptized in the name of Jesus.



This is an important story. God wants us to know that Jesus did not die just for the Jews. Jesus died for every person. This is good news for all people in the whole world.

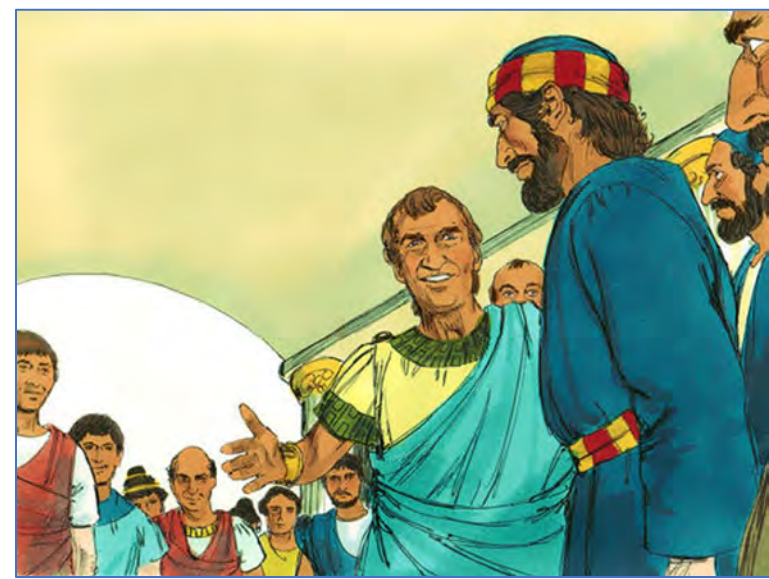
